This book provides an introduction and general overview to the field of the geography of transportation. Its goal is to provide an in-depth understanding of the interconnection of mobility and the geography of transportation.

APPROACH:

The textbook is organized in twelve chapters addressing different issues in transport geography including supply chain management, the environment, globalization, urban transportation, terminals and networks. The tenth chapter of the book addresses the usage of different quantitative and qualitative methodologies in transportation geography research and policy implementation.

MAIN FINDINGS:

- While the material is mainly targeted at undergraduate students in geography and transportation logistics fields, it also contains useful information for policymakers, practitioners, and researchers.
